

Still, there is more work to be done. At SASE, our mission is to help Asian heritage scientists and engineers achieve their full potential, and I am especially excited about our renewed focus on internal collaboration and on having *fun* while we achieve our goals in SASE 2030.

It's a focus that Shekhar Mitra and I shared when we founded SASE in 2007; we both had a start-up mentality that meant we were always supportive of each other, especially as we were addressing difficult and complex issues. To help us return to our internal collaboration roots, we partnered with a professional training organization and, over several months, participated in interviews and discussions, team development, and executive coaching. We're already seeing terrific progress, from the Squad (staff) feeling heard and valued and everyone working together

to chart SASE's path forward. SASE's future is bright thanks to our wonderful sponsors as well as professional and student leaders.





were able to fundraise \$700 for Asian Americans United. To celebrate cultural diversity, we've sought to highlight and showcase more from differing cultures, with collaborations with our fellow Asian organizations on campus. We've thought outside the box with our professional events, seeking to create events that provide important skills and the knowledge to grow and succeed regarding topics such as wage negotiation, internship and job search experiences, senior design, and destigmatizing the discussion of failure.

This was an unforgettable experience as we faced the challenges of planning a conference; however, we

While this was a momentous task, we overcame serious logistical mishaps to ensure a successful event. During the conference, we organized professional panels and skill-building workshops on topics such as diversity, cultural awareness, personal health, and pathways to

industry and higher education. Sponsoring companies were also able to connect with attendees and provide valuable opportunities and resources.

University of Texas at Austin



"SASE Texas strives to create an inclusive community where individuals new to our organization or college can find a family away from home. Whether they are a STEM major or of Asian heritage, we provide every SASE member with opportunities to develop professional skills they can use to succeed in the global business world, celebrate and appreciate diversity on campus and the workplace, and serve the people and causes in our community and beyond.

Our goals for this year were to sustain constant member engagement throughout the year and provide equitable resources for members of all majors. By constructing creative, interesting, and relevant events; strategically scheduling them; and fostering a close-knit community, our membership grew from 175 members last year to 261 paid members this year. After active and fervent outreach, 45 percent of our members are majoring in science disciplines and have

provided valuable feedback for us to better serve them. Not including sports games, brownbag socials, or study sessions, we put on 75 events for our members this year, a significant increase from 30 events last year.

The key to our success starts with the officer team and is sustained through open lines of communication within the officer team and with members. Frequent, effective communication and collaboration help to establish expectations for the group and foster a productive and comfortable work environment, which translates into a well-run organization that members can benefit from academically, professionally, and socially."


University of Calgary

"As the first Canadian chapter of SASE, our focus this past year has been on encouraging UCalgary students to become active members of their community. Despite being a commuter school, we were able to increase our membership rate by at least 10 percent following each event. Our strategy was to host a variety of events that catered to a broad audience, which allowed us to extend our reach in the community.

We organized a large professional event and a smaller, more casual networking and mentorship information session, which engaged roughly 40 students. We were successful in connecting students with local and international industry professionals of Asian heritage as mentees. We also tried to be strategic with our social events, given our status as a commuter school. We hosted an online trivia night and an origami night in collaboration with another club, which successfully raised \$264 for a Canadian

charity that helps impoverished families in Pakistan and was founded by a UofC alumna. In terms of our impact beyond the community, we aimed to connect our members with other SASE chapters regionally and nationally via Discord activities. We shared our experiences with UNM and encouraged our members to attend the West Regional Conference, and we even connected with the USCD SASE chapter to host a gaming night together in the spirit of a sister chapter event.

Our most successful event was the Resume/ LinkedIn Workshop, which had the best member turnout we had ever seen, resulting in a 26 percent increase in membership afterward. We planned for this event for six months, ensuring that it was well-advertised and that the attendees received useful tips. From this event, we learned a lot about organizing an event and fostering better relationships with our sponsors, which eventually helped us gain more mentorship program participants."




HONORABLE MENTION

Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University

"The past year has been a significant milestone for the Embry-Riddle SASE chapter in recruitment, collaborations, fundraising, and professional development. We had 10 total events and an average member attendance of 10 people last year; this year, we had 19 events and have grown our average member attendance to 23 people! Our chapter had our first collaborations with UCF SASE, ERAU SHPE, and ERAU SWE for a beach day, a OneBlood volunteer event, and International Women's Day tabling, respectively. These events helped us learn more about other organizations, better advertise our chapter, and gain new members in the process. Our chapter also had a profitable fundraiser selling dumplings and boba, where we made four times the amount of money we spent on materials. For a second fundraiser, we sold paneer biryani and orange

Tang, and we made three [times] more than we spent. Additionally, we hosted several professional events, including an internship panel and a resume review with SASE alumni to help our members prepare for SERC. Overall, our chapter has grown exponentially due to balanced educational and social events and our efforts in strengthening connections with other diverse organizations on campus. Tabling for fundraisers and consistently posting on Instagram have also significantly increased our chapter's exposure. The most valuable tip our chapter can give to newly developing chapters is to elect passionate, caring individuals to leadership positions. Having an executive board with driven officers who are devoted to building a strong community will be a major catalyst for your organization's success."

MOST IMPROVED CHAPTER

Awarded to the chapter that displayed the greatest growth, change, and improvement over the past academic year.

University of Florida

"In the 2022-2023 year, the UF Chapter of SASE innovated and optimized every aspect of our organization, growing from approximately 90 to over 350 active members in the process. This culminated in our recognition as being one of four finalists for the University of Florida Student Organization of the Year 2022-2023. In this past year, we've established a semesterly Career Fair Prep week consisting of three events: We started a SASE Sports Program that has grown to consist of 48 intramural teams, weekly casual sports events, and multiple E-Sports tournaments. We've created an interdisciplinary design team, 'SASE Engineering Team (SET),' that allows members to develop their technical skills. We've introduced a new SASE Interns Program structure that provided leadership opportunities for 120 Interns. Finally, we re-imagined our online presence, redesigned our website and Instagram, and implemented social media initiatives such as reels and blogs that increased the number of visitors to our website in the past year to over 2,000 and our Instagram following from 800 to 1,517. In the 2022-2023 year, 109 UF SASE members received offers for research, full-time, or internship positions.



Our SASE chapter has been successful because our board members are extremely passionate in creating a safe, loving, and welcoming community where all resources and members are easily accessible, setting our members up for success in all aspects of their college experience. We provide opportunities that cater to people of all interests and majors, letting our members

and their specific needs dictate our direction, rather than the executive board deciding. Many of the new initiatives we described started off as suggestions from our members, which we worked on to make realities. Our advice to growing chapters is to listen to your members. Growth comes from connections made on a personal level—not a marketing campaign."

HONORABLE MENTION

Arizona State University



"Our chapter has made substantial progress throughout the academic year in terms of membership growth, leadership development, events, and chapter finances. Since the pandemic, our chapter has made huge strides in giving our members opportunities.

Since last year, we have increased our events by 124 percent, from 37 to 46 events held within a single academic year, by providing our members the opportunity to get involved though general body meetings, socials, professional development, industry, community service, networking, tabling, fundraisers, and conferences. For the first time, we held two fundraisers, earning \$100+ from each. We nearly doubled in tabling for the organization, volunteering 25+ hours to support the mission of SASE and promote the chapter. We have 35 active members in our chapter this year, 15 more than last year.

We are known as one of the largest contingents to attend the West Regional Conference and National Convention (NC). This year, we attended both conferences, bringing 50+ members between the two. During the NC, members placed third and won 'best new hack' in the Hackathon. Among the 20+ members who attended the career fair, 26 had interviews and nine received offers of internships and full-time job opportunities, a historic high for our chapter.

In terms of finances, our goal was to obtain funds from the school and through sponsorships to maximize our funded members to the conference. In total, we were able to allocate \$7.1k for the NC and \$4,000 for the West Regional Conference. Through our fundraisers and additional promotional activities, we increased the money in our bank account by 128 percent. Another improvement was the tripling of the number of candidates who ran for office – 15 candidates compared to five from last year."



Awarded to the chapter that demonstrated and embodied the greatest spirit of service within its chapter, community, region, and nation.

University of Tennessee, Knoxville

"Founded in 2019, SASE UTK is the first Asian-interest pre-professional organization on campus. Our chapter was the recipient of Outstanding New Chapter in the 2020-2021 school year due to its resilience during the COVID-19 pandemic. We have greatly expanded this year, almost doubling our active membership. Our chapter has implemented internal opportunities like a mentoring program and executive board shadowing program, both of which could only exist due to this membership boost.

Most of our members are first to third years, which means that we can continue to impact them and foster their cultural, professional,

and philanthropic development during their collegiate years. This year, our ratio of male-to-female members is around 4:6, with a ratio of male-to-female officers at 2:5. Our recruitment conversion rate also greatly increased from the year prior. This was due to the enthusiastic marketing and programming efforts of the executive board, who planned almost four times the number of events.

Despite being a historically engineering-centric student organization, approximately 30 percent of this year's members are science majors, typically studying some biology-associated field. Our executive board has better representation as well, as there are double the number of

officers majoring in science compared to last year. To accompany this, our chapter has also made a number of connections to provide better opportunities for science majors, including Oak Ridge National Laboratory and Eastman Chemical Company.

Over the current year, the SASE UTK chapter has grown in size, diversity, and complexity. We hope to continue this development in the future and support our members as they pursue success in their fields. Our tip for other chapters is to go all out with event planning in the fall semester and to table loudly! Membership grows when your energy is high."

HONORABLE MENTION

Stevens Institute of Technology

"Since its establishment in 2012, SASE Stevens has always strived to provide a supportive community for their members to reach their full career potential. Our chapter aims to spread the three core values of SASE – professionalism, community, and diversity/culture – through biweekly general body meetings and monthly events. In these meetings, we discuss the dos and don'ts of resume writing to networking with fellow professionals to how ice cream is made with just ice and salt.

From a small school located on the Hudson River, SASE Stevens has one of the largest active membership bases in the Northeast and proudly stands as a veteran chapter in the region. We believe our strength comes



from our community and our priority in making sure that every member feels at home. Our advice for a successful chapter is to create a healthy, supportive, and welcoming community where people can grow and think innovatively."



West Regional Conference (WRC) – University of California San Diego

BASK IN THE SUNLIGHT

About The Theme

Inspired by the conference's location in sunny California, SASE's recent spotlight on mental health via the SASE Mental Health Initiative, and schools transitioning back to an in-person format, we chose the theme of "Bask in the Sunlight." With the beach only a mile away from campus and the sun always shining in San Diego. we wanted to give students an opportunity to take a moment and focus on themselves, especially in such a "grindset"-oriented society. Our final schedule of workshops was diverse with new topics ranging from project management, which can be applied to every and any field, to the transition from an undergrad to industry to UX Design, which is not typically covered when discussing topics in tech.

A Memorable Moment

The beginning of the day, when everyone was checking into the conference! The team had been working on planning the conference for so long, so to experience everything coming together felt like a dream to us. We were so happy that the attendees were excited to see the campus, pick up their merch, and network with other chapters. It really set the tone for the rest of the day.

Northeast Regional Conference (NERC) - Boston, MA

BROADEN YOUR BRANCHES

About The Theme

The Northeast Region is the largest region of SASE with record-breaking attendance numbers at previous NERCs. This year's NERC Planning Team was determined to make the first return to in-person conferences be a time to foster inter-chapter relations and rebuild lost connections. The team leaned into environmental themes, in contrast to prior years' themes surrounding engineering/ technology, to encompass their mission of encouraging science and sustainable communities. NERC was able to embody this year's theme by offering students opportunities to network in response to student feedback from previous years, and the NERC Planning Team replaced the last section of workshops for "professional networking rooms" that sparked conversations around different SASE values such as navigating personal/professional post-graduation life and exploring our cultural roots while developing our own new blended traditions. Having all-day open fundraising tables, resume rooms/group resume sessions, the career fair, and scheduling more free time

between itinerary sections also provided attendees an opportunity to broaden their networks professionally and personally.

What Made It Special

It was our first in-person conference planned by students and alumni from universities across the Northeast Region, as opposed to a singular chapter hosting. Additionally, there was a passion to create a sustainable volunteer pipeline within the region, giving opportunities to those in the Northeast to build their dedicated efforts to the larger SASE community. With the Northeast being such a large region, the valued efforts of this diverse team really shone through NERC 2023, and this model set the stage for the new year of excitement and increased active participation of chapters throughout the region.

The Biggest Challenge

No one on the team actually had experience planning an *in-person conference specifically*; very few members had planned for virtual NERC



or attended pre-pandemic NERCs, but no one really knew the reality of how an in-person conference is processed from start to finish. From budgeting for speakers and workshops to acquiring sponsors to marketing outreach to simple logistics such as name tag distribution, the NERC Planning Team was challenged to develop creative solutions to address the realities of in-person conferences. However, the new and unique solutions to these challenges ultimately paid off as attendees remarked that it was an incredibly memorable NERC and overall college experience for them. From new and applicable professionalism workshop content to silly and fun relay games during breaks, students said the best part of NERC 2023 was that they really did get to "Broaden their Branches" and understand the breadth of what it means to be part of a larger SASEFam!







olefin elastomers, thermosets, polyolefin adhesive and olefin block copolymers. Colin is a world subject matter expert for polyolefin microstructure design to support catalyst discovery, material science, and product and application development. His development contributions have pioneered the use of polyolefin elastomers in the global transportation, infrastructure and consumer industries, as well.

Tao supervises AOS's Critical Infrastructure Protection Group, overseeing 60 staff members. As a group leader at APL, he is responsible for a range of critical business functions, including group strategy, sponsor engagement, business forecasting, research and development (R&D) planning, performance coaching, and hiring. Tao engages with APL program managers to understand prospective sponsor challenges and relays that message to his staff to focus on research and develop solutions. Willing to bet big on his staff, Tao commits large amounts of his resources to bolster independent R&D

project dollars in pursuit of ideas to help solve the important challenges of our nation. Coaching and development activities are key to Tao's group; despite the many demands on his time, he meets routinely with everyone and works closely with his line supervisors to develop objectives for each staff member. Tao's research group often leads APL in hiring summer interns because he believes it is an opportunity for students to gain valuable technical and leadership experience. Tao is a well-respected technical authority on networking technologies, communication systems, and infrastructure cybersecurity. He is a strong leader at APL and in his respective communities of practice and has shown tremendous commitment to APL, his staff and our nation's critical missions.



Tony Torng, Ph.D., is a Boeing Technical Fellow and nationally recognized expert in Probabilistic Analysis and Design (PAD), especially for aging aircraft risk assessment. His major responsibilities include directing and managing research and development projects, leading advanced technology development, and performing technical work. Equally important, he is an enthusiastic and tireless volunteer, representing AAPI in the aerospace industry, education and the community. Dr. Torng was born in Kaohsiung, Taiwan, where his father was a naval officer and his mother cared for him and his older siblings. During his career, he has been granted one patent, filed three patent disclosures, and written

more than 98 technical papers. He lives his belief that AAPI people should be visible as community leaders and role models. At the professional level, he frequently serves in efforts that support the engineering profession – specifically AAPI engineers. One of Dr. Torng's most visible roles is as an elected member and current and past president of the Walnut Valley Unified School District Board of Trustees. His prior work in AAPI equity and STEM education led him to run for the school board so that he could influence more young AAPI students and their parents. He is the only AAPI member of the board and frequently engages with students, staff and parents.





Kristen Lee is a Principal Mechanical Engineer in the Air Frames, Radar Structures and Advanced Materials (ASM) directorate at RTX Missiles & Defense (RMD), a business of RTX. She is currently the Program Integrator for one of the National Advanced Surface-to-Air Missile System (NASAMSTM) international programs, in which she integrates and coordinates engagement between the Program Management Office (PMO) with Integrated Product Team (IPT), Engineering, Finance, Contracts, Operations, Global Supply Chain, Mission Assurance, and Global Trade leaders and team members. She is also a Jurisdiction and Classification Determination Subject Matter Expert

with focus on NASAMS programs. The recipient of this award exemplifies leadership and service that goes above and beyond and is deserving of the SASEsalutes' highest honor. Distinguished Career Service Award honorees have obtained significant military achievements, and their influence transcends the workplace through their leadership and mentorship.

r. Ed Oshiba became a member of the Senior Executive Service (SES) after a decorated, 25-year Active Duty career in the Air Force. In his current role, Mr. Oshiba is responsible for plans, policies, programs and budgets for Air Force installations, energy, environment, safety and occupational health objectives. With oversight of energy optimization, climate mitigation, and a vast environmental portfolio, Mr. Oshiba has a renewed appreciation for the 'āina – a value he remembers from growing up in Hawaii, where stewardship of land and natural resources is highly regarded.

Growing up in Hawaii as a third-generation Japanese American, Mr. Oshiba was shaped by other cultural values, as well, including a strong work ethic and a deep respect for elders. He was aware that many extended family members served in the military and garnered valuable life lessons from their experience. During senior year of high school, Mr. Oshiba's father urged him to pursue opportunities beyond the comfort of his immediate surroundings in Hawaii. He began exploring military scholarships and secured an Air Force Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC) scholarship for Santa Clara University, and while he didn't foresee that he was setting a path for a successful military professional career, he would eventually command three civil engineer squadrons, command an expeditionary Prime Base Engineer Emergency Force (or Prime BEEF), and serve at Headquarters U.S. Air Force levels. Mr.

Oshiba's hard work, connection to the mission and deep respect for mentors has kept him motivated through his military service toward the highest levels of Air Force leadership as a DoD civilian.

We sat down with Ed for some additional questions; here is what he shared:

Tell us about some memorable duty stations.

I planned to complete my four-year commitment in the Air Force and then "get a real job." Toward the end of my first tour, I got a call about an assignment in Korea that would give me more direct engineering experience as the Chief of Contracts Management to oversee engineering construction. That is where I fell in love with the Air Force. I felt like I was doing something much bigger than myself and contributing in important ways. It was also

where I met my wife, and I extended my tour there to two years.

I also remember being at Barksdale Air Force Base during [the September 11 attack]. Shortly after, I received a call from my leadership, "Hey, Ed. We've been asked to deploy. We cannot say where we're going or for how long. We need someone to lead a large team, and we want it to be you." That deployment was a surreal experience, leaving with a team of 50 to the Gulf and leading 200 people across 22 units. I felt a true connectedness to the mission.

What would you like to share with our SASE community?

There is a way that you can be successful whatever agency or industry you choose and keep your cultural values intact. Don't be ashamed of it – celebrate it.

"As a medical student at the Sophie Davis Biomedical 7-year BS/MD combined program, I realized that among the 72 students accepted per year, I was one of only three Asian students. Hove being surrounded by other cultures and learning from my peers, but I found myself having to advocate alone regarding Asianrelated issues such as health disparities, Asian hate crimes, and the lack of Asians in leadership positions for STEM companies. I felt alone, and I knew I wanted to find a place where I could be myself and continue my efforts to advocate for the Asian community. That's when I found SASE. Before I became SASE President in 2021, SASE only had 22 members and was lacking in funding due to the \$10.7 million CCNY budget cuts. I was able to grow SASE membership to 168 students from various majors, which helped create an environment where students could

learn from each other and collaborate. SASE became a big family where students could come together and relieve stress.

As part of my recognition of the lack of

representation. I created the SASE TedTalk: How my culture shaped my career, identity, and future. Through the SASE TedTalk, I provided students with a chance to meet and hear the stories of successful and accomplished Asian American panelists coming from different STEM backgrounds to discuss how their cultural identity affects their experience in the workplace, identity, and future. More than 80 students attended and came away with insights gained from hearing how speakers had overcome their own career struggles, which gave them hope and courage to continue pursuing their major and not letting failures stop them. In a way, the SASE TedTalk encompasses what SASE is: a society that celebrates community, culture, and career development. The TedTalk created a community where we were able to celebrate our culture of being Asian while also finding ways to elevate our career goals.

SASE welcomes people from all backgrounds and through its inclusiveness, promotes cultural sensitivity and education, unites minorities, and helps break the model minority myth that was created to pit minorities against each

other and downplay the discrimination that Asians face. And while everyone joins SASE for different reasons, those who join without expecting anything in return are the ones who will gain the most. Be open to meeting new people, ask questions, and learn from others. Step out of your comfort zone so you can learn about others and others can learn about you!"



I was able to build upon the immense progress that Victor made to build something together written from the perspective of Leadership and IT, but if I hadn't asked Rolland all the detailed questions that I did, I would not have understood the complexity of SASE's IT network to the degree I do now."






